ONLINE EXAMS: ANOTHER FEATHER IN OUR CAP

The unexpected COVID-19 situation in India affected many sectors of the country, including the education sector. All the schools had to be shut down to manage the crisis. It was amidst this that the online classes were introduced for students of every class, and our school St. Patrick's Academy, was one of the first to introduce online teaching sessions. The classroom teaching transformed into virtual teaching; which was new to all of us. This led to some student community issues, such as lack of one-on-one interaction and classroom atmosphere, network issues, and eye irritation. To evaluate online teaching effectiveness, objective type tests were conducted for every subject through google forms. As it was a successful attempt, the school decided to conduct a subjective type examination for eighty marks in every subject. The syllabus was equal to that of the half-yearly examinations conducted in the school. This was the first time any of us had given a subjective type online examination, and we were all nervous. As a student, the thoughts in my head were will our internet be stable till the end and will we be able to complete the exam on time. Since we had to keep our cameras on, it felt as if someone was always watching us. There was also no

exam atmosphere since all of us were sitting in our homes. Instead of the formal attitude we were supposed to have, all of us had a casual attitude. Many schools had asked their students to take pictures of their answer sheets and send them in the form of PDF within a fixed time. Our school did not implement this and therefore did not put any extra burden on us, so I am very thankful for that. The positive aspect of these examinations was self-assessment. The students can realize how much they have understood the concepts through the online teaching and how well they can attend the examination with confidence. It also gave us the practice that we needed for the final board examinations. The negative aspect was that since there was no effective way to monitor the students' activities, there was a high probability of cheating and copying. Overall, the approach helped engaging the students in the learning process, even though they were closed during the lockdown period.
